

WAR MEMORIAL TRAIL MAP

There are 33 names on the war memorial of men who lost their lives in World War One. Following the centenary of the war, it was felt that the village should commemorate as many as possible with a plaque.

The plaques were installed in 2017 and it was decided that the ten men of Harbury who had lost their lives in the Second World War, should also be commemorated in the same way, to mark the 80th anniversary of VE Day on May 8th, 2025.
